Hey all,

I want to thank all of you who helped with the various campaigns these last few months. It takes time and commitment to door knock, make phone calls, and hold signs at voting sites in 95 plus temperatures. I am thankful for you all and I want you to know that your hours of time spent helping our candidates are worth every minute.

We have a representative form of government that was formed in the crucible of a revolutionary war. Un-named patriots suffered through years of unimageable depredation and separation from family and friends so that we might have "a more perfect union." They died in combat, they died of disease, they died from the cold, and they died as prisoners poorly clothed and fed by the enemy.

They lost battle after battle and yet, they fought on. They had no guarantee of success and, often, no hope of ever living a life in peace, of ever going home to their wives, their children, their erstwhile livelihoods.

Our schools are now pushing LGBT+ in general and transgender specifically.

We had our own revolution yesterday as we spoke and spoke loudly. We can no longer be complacent. There is never a one and done. We must continue to preserve our faith in God and to the truth. This is not a time for compromise. We have been called by His name to rise above the din of humanism and stand firmly and uncompromisingly in the gap for truth. We are the ones, we are the cavalry, we are the answer, we are the sons and daughters, adopted by the Father through the blood of the son. Our time is here and now, and we need to carry the torch for the next generation so that they, too, might be light to the generation that follows.

Williamson County Republican Party District 10 Convention

The Williamson County Commission consists of 2 Commissioners from each of our 12 districts. In June, District 10 Commissioner David Landrum resigned from his position after moving out of the district. Since this resignation occurred after the deadline to be on the current ballot, the Election Commission has requested that each party nominate a candidate. This candidate will then go on the ballot during the November 5, 2024 general election.

Anyone who wishes to submit themselves as a nominee for the County Commission, District 10, must be a bona fide Republican, having voted in three-out-of-four Statewide Primaries (August of 2020, August 2022, March 2024, August 2024), must be active in the Party, and must reside and be registered within District 10. In addition candidates must submit a written request listing their

name, address, all contact information, explaining their desire to run for the seat, as well as any other pertinent information, to the Party Chairman, Tracy@williamsongop.org.

The deadline to file as a nominee is August 6th.

Following the nominee deadline, the bona fide candidates will then be voted on at our District 10 Convention.
