There is one more day of early voting. **August 1<sup>st</sup>** is the actual election day. If you live in an odd district and know of someone who has not voted yet, please encourage them to vote for one of our school board candidates.

### **Williamson County Commission**

There were seven meetings scheduled for this week and three of them were cancelled. Of the four that were held, I was unable to get any meaningful information on them. Next week, there are no meetings scheduled.

The budget committee is scheduled to meet Monday September 5<sup>th</sup> and I will have more information about that in next Friday's Recap.

### **Board of Mayor and Aldermen (BOMA)**

There was a joint meeting of BOMA and FMPC (Franklin Municipal Planning Commission) on Thursday. [Agenda Video](#), followed by a FMPC meeting [Agenda Video](#). The joint meeting agenda included new changes to Public Notices and hearings for annexation and proposed changes to Envision Franklin. You can click on all the slides for both on the agenda provided above. The FMPC meeting only lasted about six minutes and the consent agenda, which was everything, passed unanimously.

### **District 10 County Commissioner**

There will be a caucus conducted by the Williamson County Republican Party on August 13<sup>th</sup> to choose a candidate to fill the vacant seat in District 10. The election for that position will be on November 5<sup>th</sup>. Right now, that seat has been filled, but only until the November election. If you live in District 10 and are a bona fide Republican, you can both run for that office and/or vote for one of the candidates that will be on the ballot at the caucus. This is our opportunity to choose the candidate that we want and not have one chosen for us by a handful of commissioners. For complete information see below:

The Williamson County Commission consists of 2 Commissioners from each of our 12 districts. In June, District 10 Commissioner David Landrum resigned from his position after moving out of the district. Since this resignation occurred after the deadline to be on the current ballot, the Election Commission has requested that each party nominate a candidate. This candidate will then go on the ballot during the November 5, 2024 general election.

Anyone who wishes to submit themselves as a nominee for the County Commission, District 10, must be a bona fide Republican, having voted in three-out-of-four Statewide Primaries (August of 2020, August 2022, March 2024, August 2024), must be active in the Party, and must reside and be registered within District 10. In addition candidates must submit a written request listing their name, address, all contact information, explaining their desire to run for the seat, as well as any other pertinent information, to the Party Chairman, Tracy@williamsongop.org.

The deadline to file as a nominee is August 6th. Following the nominee deadline, the bonafide candidates will then be voted on at our District 10 Convention.
