Williamson County School Board

School board met on Monday the 22nd <u>agenda</u> <u>video</u>. The meeting starts on the video at 10:20. I was the only speaker, and I start at 14:45. At the bottom of this recap is a sign that is hanging in Bellevue Middle School in Nashville; that's only 20 miles away.

Both the Policy committee and Work Session are on February 8th and I'll have the details for them next week.

Great News!

The law suit against Williamson County Schools over the sexually explicit books is going to trial!!!!!!!! I am attaching both the suit and Judge Good's opinion. See attachments Gino 1, Gino 2 and the suit.

Action item. Eliot Mitchell apparently has moved out of District 3 so District 3 residents don't have a representative. Anyone who lives in District 3 needs to contact the Williamson County Schools and ask about this. Their number is 615-472-4000.

Williamson County Election Commission

There was a meeting Thursday and another meeting set for Next Thursday at the election commission at 405 Downs Blvd at 4:00 pm. This is an important meeting and we need all hands on deck.

• First, conservatives are being greatly outnumbered by Leftists at these meeting now... more than 5-to-1. We need more patriots to attend and take advantage of the public comment section. The League of Women Voters are bringing members out and they're all saying the same thing but they're making an impact. We're not.

- One firm we don't know who, the WCEC wouldn't announce it will apparently be performing the hand-marked paper ballot feasibility study. More information will be shared at next week's meeting of the WCEC.
- Two new vote centers have been identified but the third is still up in the air.
- The attached Early Voting location and hours have been approved going forward.
- Very little was discussed about their communications strategy.
- The possible resolution that the WCEC was planning to approve and present to the County Commission declaring information surrounding all vendors and sub vendors who support or do anything with Williamson County's elections as confidential information and not available for citizens even with public records requests, was pulled from the agenda. However, Jonathan Duda explained that since the county's IT department might have similar needs to cloak information surrounding their vendors, Tennessee Election Coordinator Mark Goins had recommended they move this effort to the county's IT department.
 - NOTE: Our team has for some time had an open records request before the IT department for information about some equipment in place in the county that could wirelessly transmit information and we've been stonewalled. This move by the WCEC and Tennessee Election Coordinator Mark Goins could, itself, be executed in secret, since the IT department does not have public meetings like the WCEC does. We are moving quickly on this.
- The WCEC approved a proposal to increase the number of precincts in Williamson County from the current 34 to 55, which could further hamper efforts to bring hand-marked paper ballots into the county without adding an entirely new machine system that is not certified by the Election Assistance Commission (EAC) nor the Tennessee State Election Commission and is projected to cost the county (which is already \$1.2 billion in debt) \$500K+.
- They also approved the Early Voting poll workers for the March election.
- The next meeting will be on Thursday, February 1, 2024 at 4 p.m. I'm awaiting the standard public notice to come out to confirm this.

Williamson County Commission

This week I'm passing on Mary Smith's newsletter that says it better than I can. Note that there is an important meeting on Monday the 29th at 1320 W. Main at 5:30 between the county commission and the planning commission. They will be discussing the 5G tower issue. I am told that there are plans for 60 more 5G towers in Williamson County and many, if not all, will be placed close to schools. They are allotting only 15 mins for public comment, but we need to fill the seats. **This is a really important meeting.**

As for what's going on in the county, this year is gearing up to be a busy one. There are already several important issues the Commission will be taking up over the next few months including:

- A special work session is scheduled for January 29th with both the County Commission and Planning Commission to discuss the current and proposed regulations on 5G Towers and the updated Urban Growth Boundaries for the municipalities and the Planned Growth Areas for the county. <u>It will be held from 5:30pm to 8:00pm at the Executive Conference</u> <u>Room located at 1320 West Main St, Franklin, TN</u>
- Nominating a Sheriff to take the place of Sheriff Dusty Rhoades prior to the County General Election to be held this August. There are currently <u>three candidates</u> who have filed including:
 - Mark Elrod, the current interim Sheriff who took over upon Dusty's retirement effective 1/1/2024.
 - o Jeff Hughes, retired Brentwood Police Chief
 - o Darren Barnes, current WCSO Detective
- Upcoming <u>School Board Candidate Forum</u> on January 30th at the AgExpo Center

As a voter in Williamson County, it is imperative that you stay informed as to why these elections matter. The newly elected sheriff will not only need to focus on recruiting and retaining highly qualified law enforcement officers, but he will also be overseeing the largest capital project this county has ever undertaken, currently estimated to be \$325 million. The school board oversees 65% of the county budget (\$517 million) and is now going to be faced with the real possibility of a significant budget cut if the General Assembly successfully passes a universal school voucher system across the state.
